What is the 63D Hands-On-Training (HOT) Mission Program?

The 63D RSC provides quality logistics MOSQ Sustainment Training to Army Reservists and logistics skill refresher training for Army Civilians on an area or regional basis.

The 63D RSC utilizes AMSAs and ECSs located throughout their area of responsibility, a Center of Excellence (CoE) located at N. Little Rock, AR and the USARC San Antonio Refurbishment Center (SARC) to provide "Real-World" Two Level Maintenance, Supply, Allied Trades and Transportation HOT Opportunities.

All HOT training opportunities have been loaded on the Army Training Requirements and Resources System (ATRRS) using school code 930A for easy scheduling and resourcing.

Training is documented on a DA Form 5165R
